

PASTOR BOB COOK READY TO MARCH!

Please keep Pastor Bob Cook in your prayers. On Wednesday, Feb 26, he will fly out to Los Angeles in order to take place in the Great March for Climate Action. On March 1 he and over 100 additional people will begin walking the 3,000 miles from LA to Washington, DC to raise awareness for global climate change. 300 will walk all or part of the way, but Bob is one of the few who is planning to walk the whole way.

Many marchers, including Bob, have spent more than six months preparing themselves, both physically and psychologically, for the rigors of marching day after day and camping in challenging conditions for 246 nights. The March is scheduled to reach Phoenix on April 8, Denver on June 17, Des Moines on August 11, Chicago on September 6, Pittsburgh on October 14, and Washington, D.C. on November 1. Marchers will walk an average of 14-15 miles per day and camp in a mobile green village which will demonstrate a range of sustainable technologies, including a mobile wind generator, parabolic solar cookers, composting toilets, and a truck powered by vegetable oil.

Pastor Bill recently spoke to Bob and he hopes to be blogging about his experience. We will pass a link on as soon as we get it. In the meantime you can learn more at <u>http://climatemarch.org</u>. And, of course, keep Pastor Bob and the other marchers in your prayers.

LENT!!
