With people moving and others passing away, our pledge starting point was lowered by over \$15,000 from 2012, with all things being equal. Overall, despite the hole we started in, our pledges are UP almost \$10,000 in 2014!

For those of you that want to review the budget numbers, be sure to study the 2013 Annual Report. This shows the actual expenditures for 2013 and also lists the income and expense budget in 2014. The Session has approved a small positive budget (\$176) even though our costs are up significantly in the coming year primarily due to moving from an interim to a new full-time Pastor. So, your increase in pledges is truly a blessing!

Hopefully in the future, we can keep this momentum going and do even more to make our programs, our music and our Mission outreach even better! As it says in Luke 12:48, "From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked." THANK YOU to all for what you are giving here at St. Paul. You make the Road of Stewardship, a great road to travel on, indeed!

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


